Hi guys. Would you like 1 or 2 Andy of the 'Stinger'? This is a device which replaces your SmartMouse. It allows you to communicate to *any* cam in the world. You can write scripts (a cache of commands) for it to execute super fast (108ns per instruction) with the cam and also houses an SPI bus for "other" types of devices you might have laying around. You can send/receive data inverse/direct convention as well as any other. You can supply the iso slot with a 3 different clock options in relationship to the actual host (the pc talks to the host, host communicates as directed to iso/spi bus). Its a wicked piece tool in which I have wrote hundreds of lines of c code as well as assembler. It has a built in enhanced 6805 architecture as well if you want to write code to download into it and run standalone without a pc.

We also have the CAMid which is similar but not the same (fixed clock for example, no spi bus) but has an LCD and a keypad. It is still being developed though.
